## **Linen Workshop with Jette Vandermeiden**

## January 19-21, 2018

Jette will also present the program at the guild meeting on Thursday night, January 18.

Our next schedule workshop will be A Linen Workshop with Jetta Vandermeiden January 19th thru the 21st, 2018.

I am taking deposits now and I need 12 people for it to make .

The schedule for the workshop is detailed below:

Schedule for the linen workshop:

Day 1 am - intro and warping

Day 1 pm - warping continues. Each person to have their own board (preferred) or mill. Possibly start pre-sleying in coarse reed.

Day 2 am - pre-sley (table space required unless done at loom). Need space for reed and some form of reed holders. Most reeds will be narrow for small floor or table looms. Warping boards will be removed.

Day2 pm - dress looms. Use of trapeze if available. Threading it individual looms.

Day3 - threading and sleying finished up and weaving commences.

As you can see this workshop is about learning about linen and how to wind a linen warp, dress the loom and use it in weaving.

Jetta stressed that you will NOT have a finished or almost finished piece at the end but you will learn a lot! (Weaving does not start until the 3<sup>rd</sup> day.)

Each finished warp will produce a lovely finished set of hand towels.

We are sharing airfare costs with the Fort Worth Guild. Their workshop will be the weekend before ours. January 12-14, 2018. For them she is teaching "All Tied Up"

If you missed that workshop at CHH you can probably take it there. Let me know if anyone wants contact information.

All yarns will be ordered from Tracy's Lone Star Loom Room. She is generously offering a 15 % discount to all CHH members instead of our usual 10%. Jetta will package all the yarns when she arrives. Jetta thinks the yarn cost will be **about** \$40.00 each. That is **extra** to the workshop fee. The cost of handouts will be included in the fee.

#### Cost:

There will be a minimum of 12 participants and a maximum of 15 because as you can see there will be a lot going on.

The cost for the three day workshop will be \$215.00 plus the linen supply fee.

Deposit will be \$107.50. Deposits are due by December 8<sup>th</sup>, 2017.

#### Equipment needed for the workshop:

- 1. looms all looms (except rigid heddle) are possible for this class. Preferred would be a small floor loom, with counterbalance being better than jack. However, table looms with jack or lift system, direct tie looms, floor looms of jack style can all be used. We are learning to put the best possible warp on each of thee types.
- 2. Warping boards are MUCH preferred to warping mills. But again, we make the equipment work to suit our needs.
- 3. Boat shuttles (low profile better than high profile) and bobbins, or damask shuttles and quills. No end feed shuttles for this class.
- 4. Reeds of different sizes. Most used will be 8, 10 or 12, depending on the linen used. As we are using all different sizes and types of linen a variety of reeds is good. It is VERY useful to have on hand several reeds of size 5 or 6 as well, as we need these for pre-sleying. They are not essential, but preferable.
- 5. If someone has a warping trapeze, this would be useful.

As people sign up, please have them state the loom they are bringing, how many shafts it has and what their preferred yarn size is. (They can use a cotton count for sizing yarn such as 10/2, 8/2, 20/2 as linen sizing is different and they may not be familiar with these sizes.) Once I know which looms are in the class, I can determine who gets what weave structure and the linen size they will be working with. Hence it is important to get this info to me asap as I can then make sure Tracy has the proper sizes available.

Since Nadia's silk dying workshop was canceled due to the storm I am proposing two possible workshops with our new member and artist in residence at **The Center for Contemporary Craft Molly Koehler.** There was interest in both of these workshops at the last CHH meeting.

Molly is an artist in resident. She is a weaver dyer and works in fiber and metals. She can also do/teach eco printing and book binding. She is a graduate of Arizona State and has just moved with her husband and pets to Houston, Montrose area. Pending availability of both Molly and space at Guild House this will be held in the spring of 2018. She is able to offer workshops in the following:

## **Book Binding:**

This is a 2 day workshop 2hrs per day. The cover is made the first day and then it needs to dry for 24 hours. Binding and stitching is done the second day. Cost is \$70.00 per student includes a kit Minimum 5 people maximum 15-20.

## **Eco Printing:**

One day workshop.

Cost \$200 per day 4 hour or so class

Materials fee \$30.00

No minimum maximum of 15-20 people

## **November Fiber Study Meeting**

November 8, 2017 – 10:00-12:00 PAPER PASTE PAINTING – Ivy Jensen and assistant Rita Joseck

Paste paper is a patterned or textured paper made by applying brushes or hand tools to the surface of paper that has been coated with thin colored paste and is still wet. This technique was used as early as the 16th century (usually by bookbinders) and is having a resurgence today. One of the distinctive qualities of paste papers is the rich 3 dimensional patterns and designs. This is achieved because when the paste is first applied to the paper and a pattern is made into it, the paste is sucked flat onto the paper as it dries, leaving a 3-D pattern, a 2-D surface.

We will be trying several recipes of paste.



What To Bring:

your own acrylic paints

aprons

implements, wide foam brushes, regular brushes, and stencils to make patterns in the wet paste

Ivy will provide:

plastic for the tables, papers, pastes, bowls for water, extra paint, tools and brushes information on the technique, including samples
