If you want to bring a refreshment to share feel free. We will be a small group of 8-9 so we do not need much.



Included will be information on preparing the cloth, estimating amounts needed and basic rug weaving techniques.

Hi Everyone. Have received a double request for volunteers. Shari Halvorson, a school nurse, has requested a spinning/weaving demonstration. She teaches knitting to 3rd and 4th graders as part of an enrichment program at the Boys and Girls Club in the Spring Branch area. The classes are on Mondays between 3:30 and 4:30 pm. They meet from now until May 20th. If you are interested in meeting with

this group and doing a little demo, let me know.

Shari also participates in a Vacation Bible School during the month of July (July 8^{th} through July 12^{th}). The hours are generally from 9 – 12. I'm including here information from Shari's email.

"The VBS is called Summer Celebration, held at Memorial Drive Presbyterian Church, 11612 Memorial Drive, 77024. The Weaving area at VBS is part of a larger "Service" focused area. In addition to exposing the children to weaving in general, we look for items that we can weave and give away. For the last couple of years, we've made "Hula Hoop" rugs using strips of t-shirts. We also do cardboard weaving, straw weaving, finger knitting/weaving. Dottie Williams is a long-time member and started this project area for us. Perhaps you know of her? She's still involved but trying to pull back a little bit each year.

I'd love to have someone who could demonstrate weaving/spinning sometime during the week, but also, I could use some ideas about new projects to try that can be finished in the week that are nice enough to give away. I've got a Large Frame Type loom that a member made for us. I think it could be used to make a welcome mat perhaps but need some advice about the materials to use."
